

## An Introduction to the Foundation

**Background** The Foundation is a North Carolina Corporation chartered in 1999. It is a public non-profit tax-exempt organization having obtained its 501(c)(3) status in 2000. The Foundation has raised over \$15,000,000 and leveraged over \$16,000,000 to implement projects addressing priority natural resource issues and building conservation capacity.

**Purpose** The Foundation is organized to carry out the present and long term mission and purposes of the North Carolina Soil & Water Conservation Districts that locally address statewide conservation needs.

**Mission** The Foundation's mission is to promote, protect and improve North Carolina soil and water resources for the enhancement of economic growth and stewardship of the natural environment.

**Structure** The Foundation is governed by a 20+ person board of directors and is managed by a two person staff with project managers added as needed.

**Objectives** The Foundation's objectives focus on three major priority areas: Building Conservation Capacity, Educating the Citizens, and Improving the Natural Environment
