



- □ Public nuisance suit <u>reduction</u>
- □ Agriculture Vision & Annual Reporting

200 farms totaling 11,000 acres






Plan, PUV roll back funds = \$50,000 county \$'s for farmland easments

Stopped nuisance ordinance against agriculture & forestry.


